Sealants Save Teeth!

What are sealants?

Sealants are thin, clear or white plastic coatings. They seal off the grooves and dips on the top of the teeth. This keeps bacteria and food from getting caught in them and causing cavities. The sealant is painted on the tooth and then hardened with a light that is shined on the tooth. The procedure is quick and painless.

Which teeth should be sealed?

The very back top and bottom teeth (molars) should be sealed. These are the teeth that get the most cavities.

How can I get sealants for my child at *no cost*?

Through the SEAL! MICHIGAN Dental Sealant Program, your child can get dental sealants and you and your family **WILL NOT** be billed for anything. Only your Medicaid, Healthy Kids Dental, MIChild or other dental insurance will be billed. This program is supported by grants and gift donations that allow kids to get sealants for free!

To have your child participate in the SEAL! MICHIGAN Dental Sealant Program, follow these simple steps:

STEP 1:

We come to your child's school to apply the sealants. The procedure is *quick and painless*.



After sealants, continue to brush your child's teeth twice a day with a pea-sized amount of fluoride toothpaste to help their teeth stay strong.
